the gentle dram

PEATY TANG

Rich gold color, with a nose of heathery smoke balanced with subtle, fragrant floral and sweet tones. The taste features a barrage of 'Peat-reek' flavours and Mother Earth with a hint of malty nuttiness. A persistent vein of smoke and peat ease to an equipoise with the understated barley sugar on the finish.

A Connoisseur's Comments:

"A gentle coating of vaguely sweet peat that multiplies in intensity and spice. The finish is long, luscious and not a little oaky... unusually dry for a smoky malt. A bit more than a "tang," believe me! Faultlessly clean distillate that revels in its unaccustomed peaty role" (94)

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AGED 10 YEARS

Gold color with hints of citrus and honey tones and a whiff of mountain heather on the nose. Round, very approachable taste with creamy sweetness balanced by gentle oaky spice, and a surge of sweetness swiftly pursued by tingling spice on the finish.

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AGED 14 YEARS

Delicate, honeyed-cream aromas, mixed with light floral malt, hints of wild fennel and a complex sweetness. The palate has a luscious ensnarement of dry oaky vanillas and clean creamy malt which never overpower a natural sweetness. A proclivity to dryness on the finish with slight peppery tones – Tomintoul without it's clothes on.

"Remains a beautiful whisky full of vitality and displaying the malt in its most naked and vulnerable state...still a worthy and delicious dram." (91)

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AGED 16 YEARS

Amber Gold color; soft fruit to the fore of the nose, with hints of hazelnut and vanilla. The palate presents hallmark lightness which embraces a capacious flavor of nutty malted barley extending to an inkling of spice and complex oak traits, followed by a velvety-then-spicy finale.
